Workshop, 12 May 2021

Welcome to this mobile video workshop in DTU Media Lab conducted by the Copenhagen-based science communication company, Outreach-Now.

**Before the workshop**, you need to download the KineMaster app for editing on your mobile. The smartphone (iPhone or Android) or iPad you are going to use should be no older than 2-3 years to be able to handle the video files with the editing tool. You also need an adapter for a microphone with a mini-jack plug if necessary (iPhone 7 and newer). Please also make sure you have at least 2 GB free space on your device. Make sure, your phone's camera is set to film in HD quality (1080p), check the phone's camera settings.

We would like to add you to a closed Facebook group, where you will upload your practice videos. So please have the Facebook app installed, at least for the day.
